



Please be advised

As part of the Village of Orland Park 2024 Sidewalk Replacement Program, severe tripping hazards identified in a 2022 Village-wide sidewalk assessment are being remediated in your neighborhood. A severe tripping hazard has been identified in pink spray paint and documented for removal in front of your residence. The Village has hired Globe Construction Inc. to perform this work.

It is anticipated that the contractor will be performing this work within the next few weeks.

What to Expect:

The contractor will initially need to call JULIE to locate any underground utilities so you will see flags in the area of the pink spray paint. Please do not remove the flags. The contractor will then saw cut the sidewalk which will leave behind a slurry on the sidewalk. This will wash off with rain over time. A crew will then follow behind to remove and replace the sidewalk in a timely manner. Damage to sod should be minimal in this process but the contractor is responsible for restoring any damage with topsoil and seed. Watering will be the responsibility of the homeowner.

Additional Concerns:

Despite the contractor's cautious work, sprinkler systems are at times damaged during the removal of sidewalk. Per Village Code (Title 5, Chapter 4), the Village is not responsible for the restoration or repair of private sprinkler systems installed within the public right-of-way. In order to prevent sprinkler damage, please mark or flag the location of nearby sprinkler heads before construction begins.

5-4-3: LOCAL ORLAND PARK WATER, SANITARY SEWER AND STORM SEWER AND APPURTENANCE REGULATIONS:



1. LAWN SPRINKLERS:

Any lawn sprinkler controls, piping or appendages placed in public rights-of-way shall be located not less than three (3) feet from any existing or planned public street curb and gutter line. In addition, all lawn sprinkler systems shall be equipped with an approved rain detection device. The Village shall not be responsible for the maintenance of private lawn sprinkler systems within the public rights-of-way. The adjacent property owner assumes all risk involved in choosing to place lawn sprinkler components in the public rights-of-way. Furthermore, the Village of Orland Park shall not be responsible for the restoration or repair of private sprinkler systems within the public rights-of-way.
